

Lorenzo Perilli (1964)

Full Professor of Classical Philology at the university of Rome Tor Vergata, Head of the Dept of Literature, Philosophy and Art History, Director of the transdisciplinary Research Centre of Antiquity Mathematics Philosophy and Medicine 'Forms of Knowledge in the Ancient World'. Scientific supervisor for the University of Rome Tor Vergata of the national research projects (PNRR) on "Cultural Heritage Active Innovation for Sustainable Society". Principal Investigator of a national 5-year research project "Ancient Science, Ancient Philosophy. The philosophical foundations of ancient science". Teaching of Classical philology, History of ancient philosophy and science, Humanities computing and, at the School of Economics, a course on European thought. He has been a Fellow of the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation in Germany (University of Munich and Berlin Academy of Sciences), a Research Associate at the Wellcome Trust Centre for the History of Medicine at UCL, London, a Visiting scholar of the Fonds National Suisse de la Recherche Scientifique (University of Zurich), a Petra Kappert Fellow at the University of Hamburg, Fellow of the Berliner Antike Kolleg (Berlin), a Visiting scholar at the University of Hamburg (2015), Munich (2014) and at Venice International University, consultant of the Centro Linceo Interdisciplinare (Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei) on computer science and the humanities. Winner of numerous research grants in Italy and abroad, he was awarded among other the 'Friedrich Wilhelm Bessel' International Research Prize in Germany in 2007 at the proposal of the Berlin Academy of Sciences. From the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei he received the 'G. Borgia' Prize for Philosophy (1997), the Prize of the Ministry of Cultural Heritage (2001) and the Mario di Nola Prize (2019) for his edition of Galen. He has given lectures and conferences at the invitation of numerous Italian and foreign universities and institutions, and reports at national and international conferences.

His research interests include ancient medicine and science, ancient Greek philosophy, textual criticism, European Thought, and humanities computing. He has published 26 books (monographs, translations and edited volumes), and more than 100 articles and book chapters. He is the Director of the academic periodicals "Technai. An international journal on ancient science and technology" and "Science and technology for cultural heritage". He has acted as a translator from English, German, French, Dutch for leading Italian publishing houses.
